Parent or Guardian Responsibilities in the Treatment and Prevention of Lice

Your child was noted to have live lice. Parents or guardians have an important role in treating the lice
and from preventing the lice from coming back. See brochure for description of lice found on the FCHD website https://www.fairfaxcounty.gov/health/schools

 _Check the hair of everyone in the household, even if they don't show signs of having lice, such as
itching. Have someone check you!
Treatment with a federal Food and Drug Administration (FDA)-approved anti-lice treatment should be
only used on those people who have live lice. For children under two years of age and women who are pregnant or breastfeeding, please consult with your health care provider for treatment advice.
_After the first treatment, complete a Lice Treatment Verification form from the school health room. Return the form to your child's school health room upon their return.
rectain the form to your owner bound from upon their rectain.
Notify the parent/guardian of your child's close contacts that your child has lice.
_Clean clothing, bedding, and soft toys using hot water and hot dryers (for at least 20 minutes). Items that
cannot be washed should be sealed in a plastic bag for 14 days.
_Vacuum carpeting, upholstery, and car seats. Do not use any pesticides inside your home.
_Disinfect all combs and brushes from your household and then wash in hot water daily. Disinfecting is
done by soaking combs and brushes in FDA-approved anti-lice shampoo for 1 hour or boiling them in water for 5-10 minutes.
Retreat your child after the first treatment according to instructions on the box or label. Return
the second Lice Treatment Verification Form to your child's school health room.
_Check and comb your child's hair with a lice egg (nit) comb to remove nits, every day for 14 days after
irst treatment.
_Continue to check your child's head every 2-3 days for at least 2-3 weeks.
_Contact your health care provider for advice if you followed all the steps and your child still has live lice.
_Use the Lice Treatment Calendar to help you follow all the treatment steps.
