




Elementary School Boundaries SY 2023-24

Elementary School LocationElementary School Boundary




Elementary School to Middle School Feeders SY 2023-24





Elementary School Capacity With Modulars SY 2023-24







Elementary School Capacity Without Modulars SY 2023-24





SY 2028-29




Boundary Adjustment Process

Tonight's Meeting

- 1. Community Meeting (s)
 - Boundary Scoping: Collection of community input on which schools and areas should be considered; may be done in advance of a Scope of Study presentation to the School Board.
- 2. Scope of Study Presentation: A scope of study for schools to be considered is presented to the School Board for approval. If the scope of study is approved by the School Board, the process will continue as listed below.
- 3. Community Meeting(s)
 - Boundary Study: Possible boundary change options are prepared by staff for consideration by the community and to collect feedback on the options.
- **4. School Board Meeting/New Business:** Staff presents recommendations for any proposed boundary adjustment to the School Board.
- **5. School Board Public Hearing**: The School Board holds a Public Hearing on any proposed boundary adjustment.
- **6.** School Board Meeting/Action: The School Board votes on a decision for any proposed boundary adjustment.

Process

- You'll have 15 minutes to review and develop responses to the questions.
- Please take note of specific questions related to the boundary/program change process or online form.

- 1. What nearby schools should be considered as part of the study?
- 2. What are the benefits of changing the boundary for Parklawn ES?
- 3. What are the challenges of changing the boundary for Parklawn ES?
- 4. What else would you like FCPS to know?
