The FCPS Work-Based Learning (WBL) Team conducted a full day of conference-style in-service training. This session was attended by sixty staff members, including High School Career Experience Specialists and Internship teachers, who are responsible for coordinating student driven WBL experiences related to CTE courses. The day began at the Inova Conference Center led by Dr. Stacey Desseker. The Inova team sponsored the conference center, breakfast refreshments, and event programming, with coordination managed by Nathan Mart, University & Community Relations Consultant.

Breakout sessions were provided on a variety of workforce development topics to include exploring diverse healthcare careers, maximizing volunteering opportunities for students, discovering data center careers, and preparing students for behavioral interviews.

A major highlight of the day was the WBL Student Panel, where FCPS alumni shared their experiences and insights with attendees. Their stories enriched the event and provided educators with a deeper understanding of the impact WBL. This feedback will help shape future programs and enhance opportunities for all students.

The event featured over 70 STEM competitions, including the TSA VEX Robotics national championships, the TEAMS Engineering competition, and solar-powered vehicle races. Highlights included leadership workshops, special interest sessions, and the installation of the 2024–2025 national TSA officers. The conference also recognized top chapters for their fundraising efforts for the American Cancer Society and culminated in the TSA Universal Experience at Universal Studios. The next national TSA conference will be held June 27 – July 1, 2025, in Nashville, Tennessee.
