#### **Discussion Topics:**

- **Survey Results Review:** The group discussed the findings of the Justice Parking Survey, led by Jeff and Anne Marie.
- **Survey Methodology:** Ms. Lidi Hruda from ORSI addressed questions regarding the survey process, methodology, and statistical significance.
- Key Survey Insights:
  - Off-street parking permits were favored by many respondents.
  - Smaller solutions or multiple minor solutions were suggested to alleviate parking challenges.
  - Nearly half of the staff felt that parking was a factor in their decision to stay or leave the school.
  - Parking garage and permit parking were identified as areas of highest interest.

#### Staff Survey Highlights:

Little to no staff carpooling was observed.

- Staff participation in the survey might have been motivated by the issue of parking.
- Part-time and itinerant staff may not be fully represented in the survey results.
- Parking was a significant factor in the decision to leave for almost half of the staff considering leaving.

#### Data Analysis and Recommendations:

- ORSI suggested using percentages to analyze the relevance and impact of different responses.
- The group discussed creating a grid to analyze parking permits, student numbers, staff numbers, and part-time staff.
- School Board parking policies and regulations should be considered for recommendations.
- A Subject Matter Expert should discuss parking policies.

#### • School Administration Updates:

 The school administration discussed the lottery process for parking permits and the reduced fees for students with Free and Reduced Lunch.

#### • Other Topics:

- o Students discussed safe walking options for students.
- School bus capacity was discussed.
- o The use of parking spaces by visitors and FC Park users was noted.
- o The Safe Routes to Schools program was mentioned for future discussion.
