Health and Medical Sciences

Sealants

Chantilly Academy Dental Careers 2 students have been practicing a new skill: placing sealants. In addition to using the mannequins in the lab, students also practiced placing sealants on custom designed and 3D printed dental arch models.

Inova Fair Oaks Hospital

STEAM Resource Teachers participated in professional learning made possible through collaboration with Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) coaches and teachers. Educators learned about providing STEAM and CS opportunities to students with diverse abilities with emphasis on elementary students in the *Enhanced Autism program*. Educators were able to make connections to use strategies with other groups.

Emergency Medical Technician

EMT students at Falls Church Academy learned that EMT's may need to go into situations with firefighters to care for a patient. This task requires physical stamina, care for the patient and trust of their colleagues. Students learned how to trust and be caring of their classmates through a trust walk exercise.

ASTEC

Exploring Health Science students at Chantilly Academy had the opportunity to use state-of-the-art medical equipment at Inova's Advanced Surgical Technology and Education Center (ASTEC). ASTEC is the most technologically advanced surgery simulation facility in the region and is used by surgeons, surgical residence, and surgical teams for training and education. Students put their medical skills to practice using laparoscopes, endoscopes, robotic surgical systems, and interactive mannequins. After the visit, students heard a presentation by Inova's Respiratory Therapy team and learned how they provide respiratory services to a range of patients from infants in the NICU to elderly patients. During this presentation, students practiced intubation, used manual breathing pumps, and saw how lungs inflate and deflate. How amazing is Inova for helping provide these experiences for our students!



Dream B!G Work-Based Learning Experience

Herndon High School students had the extraordinary opportunity to participate in a career exploration event at Inova Fair Oaks Hospital, where they were inspired to Dream B!G. This engaging work-based learning experience introduced students to the wide range of career pathways available in healthcare, sparking curiosity and excitement about the field. Through thoughtfully designed rotations in the Respiratory Department, Operating Room, and Emergency Room, students gained invaluable, hands-on insights into the dynamic roles within these areas. These interactive experiences not only informed but also inspired, leaving an impression on every participant. Adding to the event's impact, Inova's President and staff members generously took time from their demanding schedules to connect with the students. By sharing personal stories, teaching new skills, answering questions, and offering meaningful advice, they provided students with an in-depth look at the healthcare profession.
